This is the 5th annual Hagerstown Flying Circus fly-in at Hagerstown, Indiana, in conjunction with the Model T Ford Club of America, on Tuesday July 23, 2013 (rain date July 24). The fly-in starts in the afternoon and we usually have between 25 and 40 airplanes mostly vintage types attending. This started as a one shot deal for the centennial of the Model T, in 2008, when there were 600 Model T's at the airport (and almost 1,000 from all over the world at the fairgrounds in Richmond, IN.) They liked it so much it became a yearly event.

We will leave Eastbrook Plaza at 8:00am Tuesday, July 23, and check in at the Best Western in Richmond by noon. Lunch will be in the historic Depot District of Richmond. Then we will join the Model T club and drive to Hagerstown airport, stopping at the Wright Brother home on the way. The flying circus starts at 4pm. We will eat supper in Hagerstown, and then back to the motel in Richmond by sunset.

On Wednesday, the 24<sup>th</sup>, we will have breakfast at the Tin Lizzie restaurant in Richmond. Then at 10:00am we will go to the Model T Museum for a tour and dedication of the Model T powered Pietenpol airplane that was recently donated to the museum. After lunch, we will return to Columbus.
